

**N**oble Kurt L. Frevel Sr. was born in Baltimore on May 27, 1963. Kurt and his wife Beth have been married since Sept. 3, 1988, and have two sons, Kurt Jr. and Robert, one daughter, Michelle, and two grandchildren.

Kurt began his Masonic affiliation as a member of Tuscan Chapter DeMolay where he is a past master counselor, and he joined Concordia Lodge #13 in Towson in 1984. In 1986, he became a Scottish Rite Mason; and in 2001, he became a member of Tall Cedars.

PRESIDENT ART DICKERSON




## GUN CLUB




