ELECTION OF OFFICERS FRIDAY NIGHT, JANUARY 2, 2015 7:00 P.M.

The first seven officers of the Temple are the Potentate, Chief Rabban, Assistant Rabban, High Priest and Prophet, Oriental Guide, Treasurer and Recorder.

352.2 (a) The first seven officers shall be elected annually by ballot and constitute the Official Divan.

4.4 Each Temple must elect its Officers and Representatives at its annual meeting in January.

4.5 Election of officers shall be by separate written ballot and by a majority vote of those present and voting. A blanket ballot is prohibited.

4.6 Balloting must commence no later than 9:00 P.M. and when that hour arrives all other business must cease and none may be transacted until the election is concluded.

325.8 Candidates for Officers and Representatives must be placed in nomination from the floor. Nominating committees are prohibited.

325.10 (a) When a Temple elects more than one Representative, all candidates must be balloted for on one written ballot.

(b) Each member voting must vote only for the total number of Representatives to be elected, otherwise his ballot cannot be counted as a vote.

(c) A majority vote of those present and voting is necessary to elect each Representative.

(d) Only those candidates who receive a majority vote shall be declared elected.

(e) Successive written ballots must then be taken in the same manner on other candidates until all Representatives are elected.

(f) If more candidates receive a majority vote than the number of Representatives to be elected, then those receiving the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected.

(g) Blank ballots are not votes.

325.11 (a) The printing, publication, circulation or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets or other devices, by a Noble, suggesting recommending, opposing or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the Temple is prohibited.

(b) For any violation of (a), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

(c) At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election the Temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

The Imperial Council Law requires that you have your 2015 card in order that you may attend this meeting.

Boosters Club

We are approaching the end of the year and the Boosters Club is facing a very serious challenge: Will we continue to operate in 2015? If we continue to exist, we might want to raise the dues because we have not had any nobles join our organization in seven years (when I joined) nor have we had a successful fundraiser (we miss Ed Campbell) in three years.

In September, we joined the Scimeter Club for a Crab Feast, but less than 20 of our members attended. Several members had expressed interest in the Boosters having a Crab Feast, but I knew that we could not have a successful one without losing any money.

Our October meeting was a regular meeting. At our Nov. 17 meeting, we need to decide if there will be a Boosters Club in 2015 and who the officers will be.

The Potentate has asked the clubs and units to participate in a combined Temple Christmas Party, and I am inclined to have our club join them.

The picture is not ALL bleak. We have done some things successfully: increased the attendance at our monthly meetings by including the ladies and eliminated losing money on monthly meetings by hiring a different caterer. However, we have expenses such as printing and mailing the meeting announcements and costs of beverages at meetings, which are not covered by the income from our meetings.

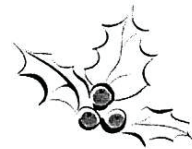

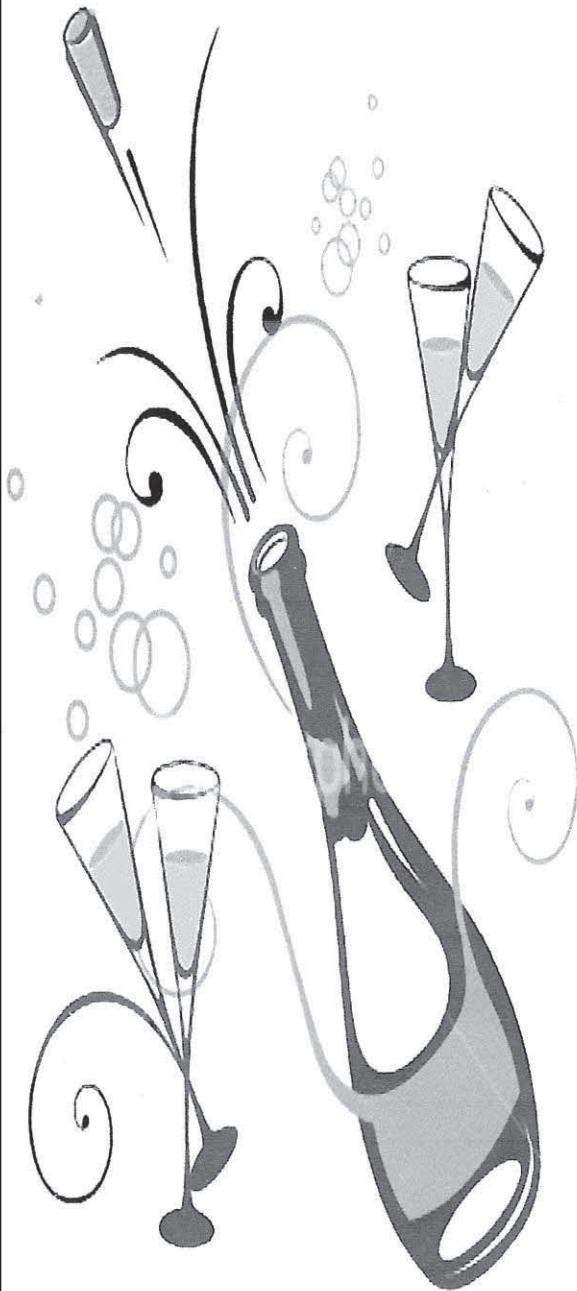
