

Previous action by the nobility of Boumi Shrine, created the Boumi Temple Corporation. The corporation members were limited to nine and they were required to be active members of the Temple Trustees. Their apparent responsibility was to oversee the day to day total administrative duties of directing the fortunes of Boumi Shrine from all facets of business and financial matters, including but not limited to investments and real estate acquisition and disposal. Subsequent rulings from the Board of Directors of Shriners International rescinded the basic need for Temple Trustees, and instead directed that they be called Financial Advisors with sole primary responsibility of overseeing the Temple Investments, in an advisory capacity only. With the dissolution of the Board of Trustees, the responsibilities per se, were assigned to the Temple Board of Directors, consisting of the seven currently elected members of the Temple Divan. Consequently, with this reassignment of responsibilities, there is no longer a need for the Boumi Temple Corporation, in as much as there no longer exists a Board of Trustees from whom their qualifications for membership derived. KNIGHTS OF MECCA


PRESIDENT ROBERT "BOB" CHASE

New Membership Referral Program Introduced

Shriners International has introduced the I AM RU program, a membership recruitment program with a new focus, new tools and detailed plans which is meant to bring in 12,000 new creations by the 2018 Imperial Session. The overall success of this program depends on the commitment of individual Shriners to "Share Your Shrine" with friends, and on temples to meet/exceed their best number of creations in the last five years - if every noble and every temple does these things, we will be very close to achieving that goal of 12,000 new members. The new program will capitalize on the increasing awareness of Shriners International, and on new technology in WebFez that provides improved information regarding the progress and status of new member prospects, so that we can offer timely help and encouragement as they work through the process.

Using Technology for Membership Recruitment

The I AM RU program is a new approach to membership development that incorporates a referral program linked to WebFez that allows current nobles to directly refer names of friends, family members and acquaintances they feel would make good Shriners. The prospective member is linked with his referring noble, promoting natural mentorship based on an existing friendship or acquaintance. The new process can be tracked and reported, and each referral triggers automatic communications to the referring noble and the prospect. Once a noble makes a referral, he receives tools and resources to mentor his prospect and hopefully lead him to creation. The program encourages constant collaboration, so that every noble can share their fraternity with the good men around them.

Attracting Interest through Well-planned Social Events

An important element of the new program is that it encourages temples to host fellowship parties and rush events to promote interest and attract membership prospects, and provides guidance that helps ensure success. For example, fellowship parties should be in a relaxed environment and have an open table/social concept, with no formalized membership presentation. These events should be open to prospective members, without pressure for membership recruitment or restoration; and membership literature should be available upon request.



Rush events have an open house, social and educational aspects, and are open to prospective members and their families. A multi-faceted presentation providing information on Shriners International, including temple clubs and units, as well as information on Masonry and affiliated organizations, is encouraged at these events. Membership literature should also be provided to all attendees.

Our goal for each Imperial Year is less suspensions, less demits and more affiliations. The leadership of Shriners International has added the ambitious goal of 12,000 new creations from Session to Session. This goal is attainable if temples focus on matching and surpassing their own best number of creations in the last five years.

There are many resources available to help us reach our membership goals. Using the new WebFez referral system is the perfect place to start, and beashrinernow.com is still a great resource. There are also several helpful tools on Shriners Village, including the Membership Toolkit, Roadmap to Membership Success, and Marketing Materials Ordering System. We encourage temples and nobles to work with their Regional Membership Director and the Office of Membership Development, and to send your temple membership team to the annual Membership Seminar for invaluable tips and information.


For any new or old Shriner reading this column for the first time, I want to explain to you what the 100 Million Dollar Club is and remind you that, this month, we will be celebrating the 95th anniversary of the opening of the first Shriners Hospital for Children.

The first Shriners Hospital for Children was opened on Sept. 16, 1922, in Shreveport, La. There are now 22 orthopaedic hospitals and burn institutes; 20 located throughout the United States, including Hawaii, and one each in Canada and Mexico.

Although each noble contributes annually as part of his dues, it became apparent that with the increased volume of children being treated and the increasing cost of treatment, an additional source of revenue was necessary. On Jan. 1, 1972, the Imperial Council established the 100 Million Dollar Club to raise funds for a permanent endowment fund for the Shriners Hospitals for Children.



PROPOSED CHANGES TO EXISTING BOUMI SHRINERS BYLAWS

PREAMBLE

This Temple shall be governed by the Articles of Incorporation, the Bylaws, and any general or special Orders from time to time in effect, of Shriners International and by the following Bylaws:

ARTICLE 1 Temple Name and Seal

SECTION 1–1. Name. This Temple shall be known as Boumi Shriners. It was granted a charter on June 4, 1884 by The Imperial Council.

SECTION 1–2. Location. It shall be located in the community designated in its charter.

SECTION 1–3. Seal. The seal of Boumi Shriners shall consist of two concentric circles, between the circumferences of which are the words "Boumi Shriners International—Baltimore, Md." Within the innermost circle is a pyramid over which an owl is superimposed and underneath the pyramid are the letters "N. M. S." Rays extend outward from all sides of the pyramid. An impression and facsimile of the seal shall be deposited with the Imperial Recorder.

SECTION 1–4. Flag. The official flag of this temple shall be as described by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 1–5. Jurisdiction. The territorial jurisdiction of this temple is governed by the provisions of the bylaws of Shriners International.

ARTICLE 2 Temple Membership

SECTION 2–1. Prerequisites. Membership in this temple, including a candidate's petition and balloting thereon, is governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 2–2. Affiliation. Affiliation into this temple is governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 2–3. Associate Membership. Associate membership in this temple is governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 2–4. Retention of Membership. Retention of membership in this temple is governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 2–5. Demit. The procedure for a demit is governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 2–6. Suspension or Termination of Membership. Suspension and termination of membership in this temple are governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 2–7. Life Membership. Life membership in this temple is governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 2–8. Honorary Membership. Honorary membership in this temple is governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 2–9. Discipline. The discipline of a member of this temple is governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 2–10. Complaints to Imperial Potentate. Complaints and correspondence to the Imperial Potentate are governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 2–11. Copies of Temple Bylaws and Imperial Bylaws. Each member of this temple is entitled, upon request, to receive a copy of these bylaws; and the recorder of the temple shall allow each member access to a copy of the Imperial bylaws so that they may be read and understood.

ARTICLE 3

Temple Meetings & Ceremonials

SECTION 3–1. Stated Meetings. <u>The</u> stated meeting must be held at least once in each calendar quarter. The exact day and hour of all meetings shall be designated by the Potentate.

- (a) December Meeting. The last quarterly stated meeting shall be held in December at the location of the temple, at which meeting the officers and representatives for the ensuing year shall be elected.
- (b) Annual Meeting. The first quarterly stated meeting shall be held in January at the location of the temple and it is the annual meeting.

SECTION 3–2. Ceremonial Sessions. Ceremonial sessions may be called by the Potentate at any time.

SECTION 3–3. Special Meetings. Special meetings may be called by the Potentate at any time, but notice must be given to each member stating the business to be considered and no other business other than that specified in the call may be transacted.

SECTION 3-4. Sunday Meetings. No business meeting or ceremonial sessions shall be held on Sunday, except upon special dispensation of the Imperial Potentate for good and sufficient cause.

SECTION 3–5. Notice Time and Place of Meetings. At least one week's notice must be given of the time and place of all meetings and ceremonial sessions. The notice shall be given in the official temple publication or by letter.

SECTION 3–6. Admission. A Noble may not be admitted to this temple unless he exhibits an official Shrine card for the then current year.

SECTION 3–7. Quorum. A quorum consists of seven (7) members of the temple entitled to vote, one of whom must be the Potentate, the Chief Rabban, the Assistant Rabban or a Past Potentate of the temple.

SECTION 3–8. Rules of Order. Unless otherwise provided by the bylaws of Shriners International, the temple bylaws or resolutions, parliamentary procedures shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

SECTION 3–9. Order of Business. The order of business shall be as follows:

- (a) Opening ceremony.
- (b) Reading of minutes of previous session.
- (c) Reading of communications.
- (d) Reading of financial statements.
- (e) Reading of petitions for membership.
- (f) Balloting on candidates.
- (g) Conferring the ceremonial.
- (h) Reports of standing and special committees.
- (i) Unfinished business.
- (i) New business.
- (k) Closing ceremony.

The order of business may be changed or suspended whenever it is in the best interest of the temple.

ARTICLE 4 Officers

SECTION 4–1. Officers. The officers of this temple are those listed in the bylaws of Shriners International. No person may hold more

than one of the offices at the same time.

SECTION 4–2. Nomination. Candidates for elective office and Representative must be placed in nomination from the floor. There shall not be more than one nomination speech for a candidate and the speech may not exceed three minutes. Seconding speeches are not required or permitted.

SECTION 4–3. Election and Appointment. The election and appointment of officers are governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 4-4. Duties.

- (a) Potentate. His duties are governed by the provisions of the bylaws of Shriners International and these additional duties not inconsistent with Shrine law.
 - (1) He may appoint such aides as may be required.
 - (2) He may assign the duties of the appointed officers not inconsistent with Shrine law and these temple bylaws.
- (b) Chief Rabban. His duties are governed by the provisions of the bylaws of Shriners International and these temple bylaws not inconsistent with Shrine law.
- (c) Assistant Rabban. He shall perform the duties appropriate to his office.
- (d) High Priest and Prophet. He shall perform the duties appropriate to his office.
- (e) Oriental Guide. He shall perform the duties appropriate to his office.
- (f) Treasurer. His duties are governed by the provisions of the bylaws of Shriners International and these temple bylaws and these additional duties not inconsistent with Shrine law.
 - (1) He shall pay all debts upon vouchers and orders for the payment of obligations that have been drawn by the recorder and countersigned by the Potentate or, in his absence, the Chief Rabban, and are consistent with the provisions of the adopted annual operating budget of this temple.
- (g) Recorder. His duties are governed by the provisions of the bylaws of Shriners International and these temple bylaws not inconsistent with Shrine law.

SECTION 4–5. Enthronement and Installation. The enthronement and installation of the temple officers are governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 4–6. Vacancies. The existence of a vacancy and filling a vacancy are governed by the provisions of the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 4–7. Delivery of records. Each officer shall deliver all books, papers and other property of the temple in his hands to his successor in office, or to such person and at such time as the temple may direct.

SECTION 4–8. Board of Directors. The composition and duties of board of directors are enumerated in the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 4–9. Compensation. The officers, committeemen and Nobles shall not receive any compensation for their services unless otherwise provided in these bylaws and appropriated in this temple's operating budget.

ARTICLE 5

Initiation Fees, Dues, Per Capita, Hospital Levy

SECTION 5–1. Initiation Fee. The initiation fee shall be determined at a stated or special meeting of this temple after notice has been

given to each member stating the proposed amount of the initiation fee. The initiation fee shall not be less than prescribed by the bylaws of Shriners International. It must be paid in full prior to initiation.

SECTION 5–2. Dues. The annual dues shall be determined at a stated or special meeting of this temple after notice has been given to each member stating the proposed amount of the annual dues. The annual dues shall be not be less than prescribed by the bylaws of Shriners International. The annual dues do not include the hospital levy or the annual per capita tax required by the bylaws of Shriners International, each of which shall be added to the annual dues. This temple may, by affirmative vote, remit dues of a member for good cause shown either to the temple or a committee selected for that purpose.

- (a) Suspension for nonpayment. A member who is two years in arrears on his dues may be suspended, pursuant to the procedure recited in the bylaws of Shriners International, unless this temple votes to remit his dues.
- (b) Restoration. A member who has been suspended for nonpayment of dues may be restored to membership in this temple by:
 - (1) Written application for restoration must be made, accompanied by written evidence that he is in good standing in his prerequisite body.
 - (2) Without a vote of the temple upon payment of all indebtedness due the temple, including, but not limited to, the two years' dues arrearages and hospital levies due at the effective date of the suspension.
 - (3) The resolution must be reported to the temple at its next stated meeting and recorded in the minutes.

SECTION 5–3. Life Membership. A member may be granted life membership in this temple as prescribed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 5–4. Per Capita Tax. Each member of this temple, other than life per capita members and associate members, shall pay Shriners International per capita tax as prescribed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 5–5. Life Per Capita. A member may pay the sum prescribed by the bylaws of Shriners International and, thereafter, be exempt from the annual per capita tax.

SECTION 5–6. Hospital Levy. Each member of this temple, other than Permanent Contributing Membership purchasers, shall pay the hospital levy as prescribed by the bylaws of Shriners International. This temple may remit the hospital levy of a member whose dues have been remitted because of hardship.

SECTION 5–7. Permanent Contributing Membership. A member may purchase a Permanent Contributing Membership in the Hospitals as prescribed by the bylaws of Shriners International and, thereafter, be exempt from the hospital levy.

SECTION 5–8. Assessment. The temple may levy an assessment on its members as prescribed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

ARTICLE 6 Fiscal

SECTION 6–1. Fiscal Year. This temple must arrange its books of account, annual report and audit to conform to the calendar year.

SECTION 6–2. Budget. This temple must adopt an annual budget. Its preparation, inspection, presentation, adoption, appropriations, amendments, temple reports and Imperial Recorder filing are governed by the bylaws of Shriners International. The adoption of the budgets constitutes the appropriation of funds for the purposes indicated in the budgets, except that, in the case of the capital budget, it shall constitute an appropriation for expenditure of funds

in the current year only. Budgets may be amended at any meeting of the temple, except that amendments to the capital budget which result in a capital budget in excess of Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars, shall be approved by the Board of Director with the recommendation of the Financial Advisory Committee and an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the general membership present and voting at such meeting.

SECTION 6–3. Checks and Payment or Transfer of Funds. Transfers of funds and payment of obligations of this temple shall be made into and from depositories approved by the board of directors, pursuant to procedures adopted by the board of directors. These may include:

- (a) Wire and other electronic transfer of remittances for payment of obligations of this corporation; or
- (b) Wire and other electronic transfer of remittances for payment of obligations of this temple; or
- (c) Voucher, imprest or payroll check disbursement signatories for payment of obligations of this temple.

SECTION 6–4. Required signatures. All monies of the Units, Clubs, Temple, their committees, and any affiliated subsidiary or appendant corporations or funds thereof; shall be subject to withdrawal or expenditure only upon the signature of at least two authorized individuals, except as otherwise provided in these bylaws, or the bylaws of Shriners International. As to temple funds, it shall be upon the signatures and countersignatures of any of two of the following persons:

- (a) The Potentate or, in his absence, the Chief Rabban
- (b) The Treasurer or, in his absence, the Recorder

All checks and payments must be supported by vouchers or requisitions.

SECTION 6–5. Monthly reports. Each Noble, committee, unit or other organization of this temple that is authorized to incur indebtedness or to disburse or collect funds, shall make a detailed financial report, accompanied by receipts or vouchers to the board of directors monthly or at such other times as may be required.

SECTION 6-6. Appropriation.

- (a) Jewel or Token. An appropriation not exceeding Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) shall be set aside by the Treasurer from the general funds of the temple, for the purchase of a suitable jewel or token to be presented in the name of the temple to their retiring Potentate, upon installation of his successor in office.
- (b) Potentate's Personal Expense Fund. A personal expense fund of not more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) shall be set aside by the Treasurer from the general funds of the temple at the beginning of each year, subject to the order of the Potentate, without the necessity of his accounting therefore. Such fund shall be specified and approved in the yearly budget.

SECTION 6–7. Construction Program and Secured or Long Term Obligations. Prior to commencing a construction program or incurring a secured or long-term debt, as defined by the bylaws of Shriners International, this temple must follow the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 6–8. Sale of Temple Assets. Prior to this temple, or any of its affiliates, selling, leasing, exchanging, mortgaging, pledging or otherwise disposing of all or substantially all of its property or assets, it must follow the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 6–9. Fiscal Reports Available to Members. This temple must make available to its members the fiscal reports and documents, as prescribed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 6-10. Fidelity bond. This temple must procure a

corporate fidelity bond as prescribed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 6–11. Insurance. This temple must procure insurance policies, and the Potentate must appoint an insurance advisory committee, as prescribed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 6–12. Audit. This temple is required to have its financial statements, and those of its affiliated and appendant corporations, including shrine club holding corporations, audited or reviewed by a certified, chartered or licensed public accountant at the close of each year, as provided by the bylaws of Shriners International, and a copy of the accountant's report and accompanying financial statement must be filed with the Imperial Recorder.

SECTION 6–13. Indemnification. The official divan, committee members, officers and employees shall be indemnified by this temple for all expenses reasonably incurred by them in defending themselves from any proceedings instituted or threatened against them provided the temple votes that they have acted within the scope of their authority and are not guilty of misfeasance and malfeasance.

ARTICLE 7 Committees

SECTION 7–1. Leadership Search Committee. This temple may have a Leadership Search Committee. Its appointment and duties are governed by Shriners International.

SECTION 7–2. Insurance Advisory Committee. The temple shall have an Insurance Advisory Committee. Its appointment and duties are governed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 7–3. Financial Advisory Committee. This temple shall have a Financial Advisory Committee. It shall serve in an advisory capacity to the board of directors.

- (a) Composition. It shall consist of seven at-large members of this temple together with the Potentate, Chief Rabban, Assistant Rabban and Treasurer. The Recorder shall be a member ex-officio without the right to vote. Two shall be elected in each of the even years and three in the odd years as their respective terms expire. They shall be limited to two full terms of three years each.
- (b) **Duties.** It shall:
 - (1) Analyze and make recommendations as to the financial affairs of the temple.
 - (2) Examine the proposed major financial obligations and expenditures before such obligations or expenditures are incurred or made.
 - (3) Review all necessary current expenses.
 - (4) Examine whether any officer, department, committee, organization, unit or individual having authority incurs expenditures that exceed the appropriations set out in the budget.
 - (5) Examine the system under which the financial affairs of the temple, and every subordinate body thereof, are administered and made such recommendations from time to time as may be deemed for the good of the temple or any subordinate body thereof.
 - (6) Review any bill for travel, hotel or entertainment expense of any officer or representative to determine if it is reasonable and necessary and within the budget.
 - (7) Have access to all financial books, papers and accounts of the officers and review them on a periodic basis, and recommend certified public accountants for examination and audit.

- (8) Review the financial institutions in which the funds of the temple are to be, or already are, deposited.
- (9) Investigate suitable investments and investment institutions for the funds of the temple.
- (10) Evaluate the proper coverage and limits of the bonds for the Treasurer and Recorder, and any other officers required to be bonded.
- (c) Reports. This committee shall issue its findings, recommendations and reports to the board of directors of this temple.
- (d) **Quorum.** Seven members of this committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SECTION 7–4. Other Committees. The Potentate shall appoint such other committees as may be required for the operation of the temple's affairs.

ARTICLE 8 Prohibited Practices

SECTION 8–1. Unlawful Activities. It is unlawful for this temple, or any unit or club under its control, or any group of its members, or any member acting for or on behalf of the temple, to promote or take part in any engagement or enterprise prohibited by the law of the land.

SECTION 8-2. Fez. No device, ornament, title, wording or adornment other than that permitted by the bylaws of Shriners International may be used on the fez.

SECTION 8–3. Shrine Law. A Noble may not violate Shrine law. The provisions of Shrine law are found in the articles of incorporation and bylaws of Shriners International and the general and special orders at the time in effect.

SECTION 8–4. Alcoholic Beverages. The consumption of alcoholic beverages during parades and ceremonials is forbidden by those Nobles participating therein.

ARTICLE 9 Temple Units And Shrine Clubs

SECTION 9–1. Approval. No temple unit or shrine club may be organized, or continue to exist, without the express written approval of the Potentate.

SECTION 9–2. Bylaws. No temple unit or shrine club may be organized until its bylaws have been approved in writing by the Potentate. No amendments to such bylaws are effective until approved in writing by the Potentate. The Potentate may direct such modifications of the bylaws as he deems appropriate.

SECTION 9-3. Membership.

- (a) Units. Temple units must be composed solely of members of this temple. The fez of the temple must be worn at all appropriate times except for such units which do not normally wear fezzes.
- (b) Clubs. Temple shrine clubs may include Nobles of other temples. All members of the shrine club are eligible to hold office.
- (c) Election of Officers. The temple units and shrine clubs shall elect their officers for the ensuing year no later than October 31 of the then current calendar year. The list of the elected officers is to be presented to the recorder of the temple by the last day of November immediately following, for approval by the incoming temple Potentate.

SECTION 9–4. Records. The temple units and shrine clubs shall keep such financial records and inventories as directed by the Potentate.

SECTION 9–5. Funds. The assets of shrine clubs and temple units

belong to this temple. However, in the discretion of the Potentate, he may allow assets to be in the custody of the shrine clubs and the temple units. Moneys in the custody of shrine clubs and temple units shall be deposited into accounts in the names of the shrine clubs and temple units. The clubs and units may not accumulate funds for any purpose other than for the benefit of the membership, the temple and the temple hospital patient transportation fund without the express approval of the Potentate (if for current year operations) of the temple board of directors (if for a period beyond the current years operation).

SECTION 9–6. Financial Reports. The shrine clubs and temple units must prepare and submit to the board of directors all financial reports required by Shrine law. The financial reports shall bear a certification that they are true and correct and that no money or property is held for the benefit of the reporting organization. Funds being accumulated for any shrine-authorized purpose shall be identified as being reserved for that purpose in the financial reports.

SECTION 9–7. Government. The temple units and shrine clubs are governed by the provisions of the bylaws of Shriners International and these bylaws not inconsistent therewith.

SECTION 9–8. Organization of Nobles. An organization of Nobles meeting as such, as defined in the bylaws of Shriners International, are governed by such bylaws.

ARTICLE 10 Temple Publication

SECTION 10–1. Official Publication. A magazine or newspaper may be established as the official publication of this temple. It shall be proper to publish all official calls and notices therein.

SECTION 10–2. Advertising. All advertising accepted for the official publication shall be non-offensive and in compliance with the bylaws of Shriners International and these bylaws, and is restricted to be the temple publication. No paid advertisement shall appear as part of any official notice.

SECTION 10–3. Staff. The Potentate shall appoint the editor and approve the appointment of staff members by the editor. The editor and staff may be known as the "Press Corps."

ARTICLE 11 Amendments

SECTION 11–1. Amendments. These bylaws may be amended as provided by the bylaws of Shriners International.

SECTION 11–2. Automatic. When a change is made by Shriners International affecting Shrine law, and the change affects the bylaws of this temple, the bylaws of this temple are changed, ipso facto, to conform with those of Shriners International.

SECTION 11–3. Inconsistencies. In the event of an inconsistency between these bylaws and the bylaws of Shriners International, the bylaws of Shriners International supersede these bylaws.

These changes will be presented at the October Business Meeting for voting by the general nobility.


